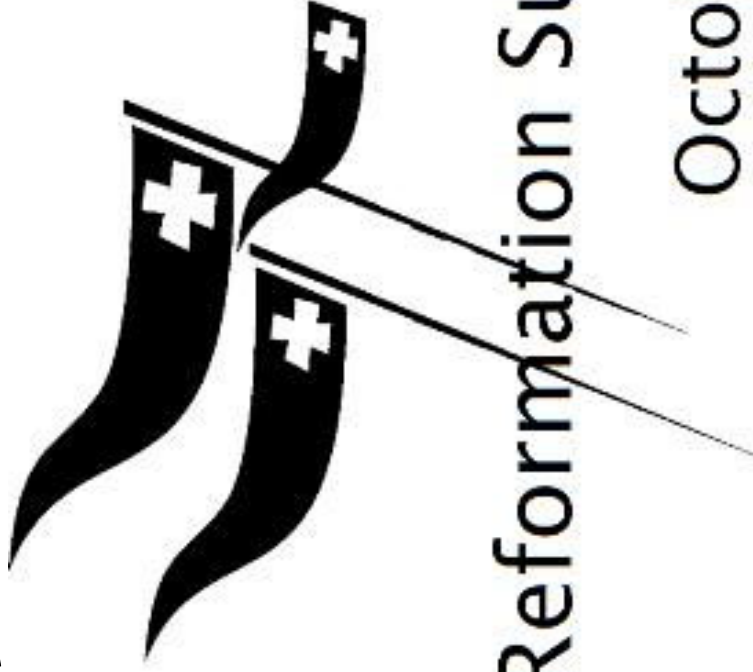

Dear Calvary Family,

I'm sure that over the past few years, you have all heard about our sister parish, *Espirito de Gozo (Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church)*, in the community of Brisas del Valle, El Salvador. We include our Salvadoran brothers and sisters in our prayers, we helped them build a new church and we send contributions every month to help them cover their basic necessities. Deuteronomy 15:11 states "Since there will never cease to be some in need on the earth, I therefore command you 'Open your hand to the poor and needy neighbor in your land.'" But how well do we really know our brothers and sisters?

Our church has sent mission groups to this tiny Central American country in both 2006 and 2008. 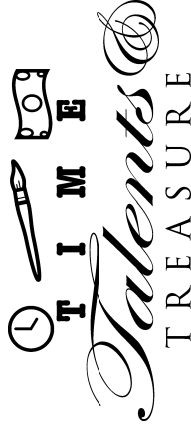

about their lives and work and this is what they had to say:

How is your familial situation? “We live together in a small house in Apopa, El Salvador with our son Jorge, our daughter-in-law, and our grandson.”

When you do have free time what do you like to do? “We enjoy playing with our grandchildren.” Pastor Matias - “I also enjoy watching a little television to relax”.

Pastor Martina - “I dedicate the majority of my free time to caring for the house.”

What is something that you don't like?

Pastor Matias - “I don't like putting off my pastoral work.”

Pastor Martina - “I don't like being sick.”

What is a typical day for you all? A typical day for both Pastor Matias and Martina includes attending to the communities, celebrating worship services, exchanging ideas, keeping in touch with us here in Morganton through e-mail and caring for their family. Because they can't be everywhere at once, they have to schedule worship services on different days of the week so that they can physically be at each of the churches.

Here is a glance at their busy schedule:

Sundays - They celebrate worship services at *Milagro de Dios* (God's Miracle) Lutheran Church in Guaycume and *Espiritu de Gozo* (Spirit of Joy) Lutheran Church in Brisas del Valle.

Mondays - Matias and Martina worship and meet with other pastors and church lay workers.

Tuesdays - Worship service at Loma de Ramos.

Wednesdays - They meet at Casa Concordia (a Lutheran outreach center in San Salvador) for Pastoral Training workshops. Every other week, they meet with the Parochial Committees of the different communities to address community needs and have Bible Study.

Thursdays - They rest.

Fridays - They hold Worship services in Brisas del Valle.

Saturdays - In the morning they have a worship service in San José Buena Vista and in the afternoon they have a worship service in Colón.

On top of leading all of the worship services for these 5 communities, Matias and Martina help with community programs for senior citizens, Sunday school, Summer Bible School, the elementary school in Loma de Ramos, and scholarship opportunities for the students of the 5 communities.

As you can see, they stay very busy and rarely have time to rest.

How has the relationship between our churches and communities affected you all?

Pastor Matias - “Our relationship strengthens us morally and spiritually, and your accompaniment gives us the courage to continue with our ministerial work.”

Pastor Martina - “It fortifies us to know you all and the great love that you all have for us.”

What are your hopes for the development of the relationship between our churches and for the future in general?

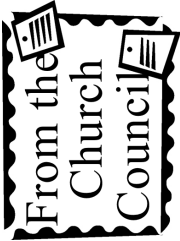
Pastor Matias - “I hope to consolidate the church's program for seniors and establish a Seniors' Home where they can receive medical, spiritual and recreational attention. My other hopes include more support and attention of the sick, a basketball court for the youth, and that we continue to build the fraternity with which God has blessed us.”

Pastor Martina - “I hope that both of our congregations continue growing in the faith of Jesus Christ and that we communicate more frequently and you all visit El Salvador more often. Also it would be wonderful to go to the United States to meet you all there at Calvary Lutheran.”

Finally, is there anything else that you would like us to know?

Pastor Martina - “How beautiful it would be to have you all closer to share experiences with us and strengthen us all in the same faith. May God bless everyone, especially you all.”

May God indeed bless everyone, especially the work of these two incredible individuals through their patience, perseverance and undying love.



CLC Congregation
Meeting Summary
September 2009

Council President Mike Imboden called the meeting to order, and Philip Rector gave the devotion and prayer. The minutes for the August meeting were approved.

Pastor Mike Riley talked about his meeting with other pastors at Lutheridge and about his continuing education seminar at the Alban Institute at Lake Junaluska. He discussed several upcoming events at the church and announced that he will be visiting Calvary college students at their various institutions of learning October 13-16th. He noted that we will have two worship services on Reformation Sunday, October 25, since we have had two joint worship services in as many weeks. Pastor also mentioned that he would like to see Calvary's sanctuary used more for community concerts, perhaps by the Lenoir-Rhyne choirs and other groups. Mike I. offered to issue an invitation to the L-R music department.

Under Old business the status on the reroofing project was noted from the Congregational meeting of Sunday, September 20th. The recommended contractor (Dave's Roofing of Morganton) and the method of financing (\$10,000 from Special Fund, \$5,000 from Building Reserve Fund, \$3,000 from Unrestricted Funds, and \$18,000 addition to existing loan at First Citizens Bank of Morganton) were approved by the congregation at the meeting on Sunday, 20 September 2009.

Mike Imboden noted that Financial Secretary Judi Huffman had reported that, as of 9/21/09, the total number of returned EOGs (Estimates of Giving) is 103, amounting to

\$221,239.92. It was decided to wait until October to see how many of the remaining 86 EOGs are returned before issuing reminders.

Angela Williams reported on her talks with several folks at different churches about their youth ministry and found that there are many different levels of ministry. She is working with Tammy West, NC Synod, to explore options and possibilities. More will be discussed during the budget process.

Board activities were discussed and several important dates were mentioned: Cake and refreshments will be served immediately following the 11:00 worship service on October 25 in celebration of the confirmation of Amanda Rector and Will Duncan.

The annual meeting will be held Sunday, November 15. The New Member luncheon will be held following the 11:00 worship service on November 22 in the New Fellowship Hall. The Christmas cantata will be performed at the 11:00 worship service on December 13. The Christmas play will be presented in the evening of December 13.

Additional news items are that Jim Voltmer is serving as the 2009 budget chair person, Susan and Philip Rector have accepted the post of Youth Advisers, and the Health Cabinet will meet in October to form a recommendation for a parish nurse.

The council person for October is Scott Wilson. The next congregation council meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 20 at 7:00 p.m. This is a week earlier than the normal schedule.

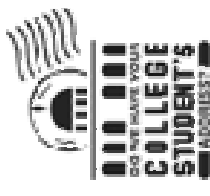
